Too often, as I scroll through social media, I see advertisements for deals that are obviously too good to be true. It's always some company selling an item for an unbelievable price... as long as the customer pays shipping. Several years ago, I decided to order an article of clothing, hoping the deal they were offering was legitimate. In fact, once they had me on their website, they offered even more deals that I couldn't pass up. With the promise of low-cost shipping and a return policy, I took the chance. After about 8 weeks, the items finally arrived in a package wrapped like a giant lumpy paper sausage. They had taken the clothing items, wrapped them up together as tight as possible, cover them in shipping paper, and used what looked a half roll of packing tape to hold it all together. Needless to say, nothing inside was what I expected, nor were the sizes true to what had been advertised. To top it off, when I looked into returning the items, the "restocking fee" was more than the sale price I originally paid. I found out the hard way, it truly was a deal that was too good to be true.

Sometimes this is how life can be; we are handed a raw deal that leaves us in a bad place. Sometimes we are led to believe one thing when the exact opposite is true. Sometimes we are given empty promises that leave us feeling foolish and empty ourselves. Yet... not everything that is empty is necessarily bad.

Early on that Sunday morning, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb of Jesus to prepare his body for a proper burial, but when she arrived, she found the stone had been rolled away from the entrance, and Jesus' body was nowhere to be found. Surprised at what she had observed, she ran back to tell the others what had happened. Of course, we know the end of the story, and know that this was a situation where "empty" was a good thing... no, let me change that... a GREAT thing! As we look back today at that empty tomb, we know that it was not empty at all... it was a tomb full of hope and promise.

1 Peter 1:3 says, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead," (ESV)

Over the next 40 days, there were many witnesses to Jesus' resurrection. Paul says in 1 Corinthians 15, "He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said. He was seen by Peter and then by the Twelve. After that, he was seen by more than 500 of his followers at one time," It's amazing to think there were so many eye witnesses who saw Him, spoke with Him, touched Him, and even ate with Him before He ascended into Heaven. And as He ascended, they record Him saying that He would send the Holy Spirit to us, and that He would return soon. What an amazing promise! That He will return and completely fulfill that glorious hope that He gives to all who believe in Him as Lord and Savior.

Through an "empty tomb," we are given a Living Hope, not a dead one where contracts are broken and promises are left unfilled. Through an "empty tomb", we are shown a victorious Savior who conquered death and keeps His promises. A Victorious Savior who took on the cross, because He knew it was the only way to save humanity. Jesus is our Living Hope!
